Increased Fruit & Vegetable Benefits for WIC participants – Additional fruit and vegetable benefits are now available on WIC (through November 30). To include: \$52 per month for most breastfeeding women, \$47 per month for most pregnant or postpartum women, and \$26 per month for children (1 to 5 years old). To increase buying power even further WIC participants can shop at participating Maryland Market Money locations. Check out participating markets <u>here</u>.

Applications will be accepted on a rolling basis until FY24 funds are exhausted. New and existing community gardens are eligible to apply. - WSSC Water Partners with Promise WSSC Water is pleased to announce that we've partnered with Promise to offer affordable, flexible and interest-free payment plans to our customers. This new financial assistance program allows residential and commercial customers with a past-due balance of \$50 or more

to establish a payment plan. By establishing a payment plan for past-due water and sewer bills and staying current with the plan, customers will avoid late fees and possible water service turnoffs. The program launched in early 2022 and remains open until September 2023 to accept applications from residents in the state of Maryland, including WSSC Water customers, homeowners and tenants who are in need of assistance with paying their water/sewer bills.
